

Using This Revisable PDF Form

1. Copies – original to witness then to court.
2. Prepared by
 - a. First page – Data Element Nos. 1, 2, 4 and 6 are completed by clerk or person taking deposition.
 - b. First page – Data Element No. 7 is completed by the witness.
 - c. Second page – Data Element Nos. 1 and 2 are completed by the witness.
 - d. Second page – Remaining Data Elements are completed by the person taking the deposition and, if required, person authenticating signature of person taking the deposition.
3. Attachments – copy of will.
4. Preparation details
 - a. Data Element No. 6 – Clerk or person taking deposition is to enter the page number of the attached will on which the witness’s signature is displayed.
 - b. Data Element Nos. 10 and 11 – Under Rule 4:3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia, if a person taking a deposition outside of Virginia does not have a seal, an official who has a seal must authenticate the signature of the person taking the deposition. If a commissioned officer in the U.S. military took the deposition, the commanding officer of the installation or ship must authenticate the officer’s signature. In this instance, no seal is required.

Did the decedent acknowledge the signature, which was not made in your presence, to be his or her signature, in the presence of you and the other witness(es), with all of you together at the same time? **Ans.**

c. (Ask 3c. only if the answer to 3b. is "No")
Did someone else, and if so, what person, make the decedent's signature for him or her, at the decedent's direction, with you and the other witness(es) all together at the same time? **Ans.**

d. (Ask 3d. only if the answer to 3c. is "No")
Did the decedent acknowledge that his or her signature had been made at his or her direction by some other person, and if so, what other person, with you, the decedent, and the other witness(es) all together at the same time when the decedent made that acknowledgment? **Ans.**

e. (Ask 3e. only if the answer to 3d. is "No")
Did the decedent acknowledge this paper to be his or her act in the presence of you and the other witness(es), with all of you together at the same time? **Ans.**

4. Was the decedent of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding and of 18 years of age or older at the time he or she signed the will or acknowledged the signature or act? **Ans.**

5. a. Did the decedent request that you and the other witness(es) sign this paper as witness(es)? **Ans.**

b. (Ask 5b. only if the answer to 5a. is "No")
Did someone else, and, if so, what person, ask that you and the other witness(es) sign this paper in the presence of the decedent? **Ans.**

Data Elements, page one

To be completed by clerk or person taking the deposition:

1. Name of decedent.
2. Name of deponent (person testifying that the facts are true).

3. Name, age and address of the deponent.

To be completed by clerk or person taking the deposition:

4. Date of attached writing (will).
5. Name(s) of other witnesses (other than deponent) who signed the writing.
6. Page on which deponent is asked to verify his/her signature. See Using This Form, 4(a).

7. Deponent answers “yes” or “no” to questions 3a. through 5b.

- 6. Did you and the other witness(es) sign this paper in the presence of the decedent? Ans.
7. Do you know of any other will of the decedent? Ans.
8. Did the decedent execute this will freely and voluntarily as his or her last will and testament? Ans.

See Rule 4:3, Supreme Court of Virginia: Depositions taken in Virginia do not require a seal. If a person taking a deposition outside Virginia does not have a seal, an official who has a seal must authenticate that person's signature. U.S. military: A commissioned officer may take a deposition; his or her signature must be authenticated by the commanding officer of the installation or ship: no seal is required.

Data Elements, page two

1. Deponent says “yes” or “no” to questions 6 and 7.
2. Signature of deponent.

To be completed by the person taking the deposition and/or person authenticating the signature of the person taking the deposition:

3. Location where deposition of deponent is taken.
4. Person authorized to take depositions is to check applicable box.
5. Date deposition is taken.
6. Signature of person who took deposition if other than clerk, deputy clerk, or notary.
7. Signature of clerk, deputy clerk or notary who took deposition. Check appropriate title box.
8. Date notary public’s commission expires.
9. Notary public’s registration number.
10. Court name if deposition taken at court.
11. Signature of person authenticating signature of person who took deposition. See Using This Form, 4(b).
12. Title of person authenticating signature of person who took deposition.
13. Fee charged by person certifying deposition, if applicable.
14. Name of person who charged the fee, if applicable.
15. Name of person who paid the fee, if applicable.
